SHERIDAN PARK GOLF CLUB, INC.

This club was established on February 16, 1933 with a meeting held in the Village Hall and attended by approximately 40 interested residents. Village Engineer, Charles F. Duhscherer of 65 Kinsey Avenue, explained the layout of the course which consisted of nine holes. Charles Gould, Secretary of the Buffalo District Golf Association, then discussed the history of golf in this area. The club has been associated from the beginning with The Buffalo District Golf Association, The Western New York Municipal Golf Association and The United States Golf Association.

Sheridan's first officers were elected at the second meeting on March 16th, and by April 13th there were 43 paid memberships. By May 4th, 20 new applications were entered. Philip Barth was authorized to have the club incorporated during this first year and

\$40.75 was expended for this.

Generous local merchants donated tournament prizes, the Town Board continued to improve the course and Sheridan began many successful years of promoting and encouraging play on the public golf links. During most of these years we owe much to our good friend Jack Sexton, whose experience and skill help to maintain the fine reputation of our fairways and greens. During the years 1936 and 1937 more holes were added to the original nine and on May 7, 1938 the Sheridan Park Golf Course was officially opened with eighteen holes.

At present the Town Board has awarded contracts for improving and lengthening the layout. The costs amount to \$88,229.00 and by 1958 we will be fortunate in having as tough a championship course as any in the district. We should endeavor to improve our membership and enter into a spirit of renewed vigor for promoting good relations with our fellow members, our district competitors and with those people who have recognized our needs and provided us with vast potential stature. Let us work together and offer our services, our knowledge and our friendship wherever we can to boost Sheridan.
