New Member Orientation

Welcome to the Sheridan Park Golf Club. We're excited to have you as a member! Our club holds several tournaments and social events throughout the year. An event calendar is attached, also posted at the Sheridan Park Golf Course and on our website http://www.SheridanParkGolfClub.com

Getting a Handicap - The first thing you need to do is establish a handicap. Our club follows all Handicapping Rules and Procedures of the USGA, uses the USGA's GHIN Handicap System, and is licensed by the NY State Golf Association to issue official USGA handicaps. Note that the USGA's system has now merged with the World Handicap System as well. If you're coming from another club and have a USGA handicap on the GHIN system already, that handicap will be brought forward to our club. If you don't already have a handicap, you'll need to establish one before you can play in handicapped events. Our Handicap Chairman this year is Bob "The Sheriff" Lombard. 716-698-4269 or redegolf@yahoo.com

Establishing a Handicap – You'll need to post three 18-hole scores at any course before a handicap is established. Scores for all 9-hole and 18-hole rounds at any course must be posted in the GHIN system either online or with GHIN Smartphone app. To Post a score on the internet use the link https://www.ghin.com/login. Handicap posting in our region begins April 15 and ends October 31 for rounds played in our part of the country. If you travel to warmer climates and play there – you must post those scores as well. When in doubt, just try to post the round – the system will tell you if it can't post it because it's out of season. The system will set a handicap index which follows you from course to course. Your course handicap is set by the combination of your handicap index and the course handicap for the course you are playing. I strongly encourage you to read the Rules of Handicapping posted at https://www.usga.org/handicapping/roh/2020-rules- ofhandicapping.html. It describes how your handicap is calculated (it's actually an indication of how you score on a "good day" and not an average of your scores) and all sorts of other things you should know.

<u>Tournaments</u> - Once you have a handicap established you can start playing in Club tournaments. Our club hosts several large tournaments each year and also has a weekly tournament.

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<u>Weekly Tournaments</u>, you can play your 'tournament round' anytime between Tuesday and Sunday but must play with another club member who either scores your round or attests your score.

- You can only play one "Weekly Tournament Round" per week and you must sign your name on the sheet in the Men's Locker Room prior to starting your round. Every weekly tournament round must be witnessed by another Club Member and that other Member must either keep your score or attest to your score. When you're done, write your gross score, subtract your current handicap from the handicap report posted in the Locker Room, sign your Scorecard, have the Club Member you played with sign to attest your score, and put your signed/attested scorecard in the box by the showers.
- The club has 3 handicap classes (A -6 & Under, B 11 16, C 17 and Over) and prizes are awarded weekly for the best 3 net scores in each handicap class. Winners are posted weekly and prizes are awarded to winners. 1st Place wins
- (3) \$20 gift cards, 2nd and 3rd place each win (2) \$20 gift cards.
- Each member can only win two weekly tournaments a year so your chances of winning improve as the year goes on

Major Tournaments we now do signups both electronically and with a signup sheet posted in the Clubhouse. We send an email announcing signups well in advance of each tournament. If after you've signed up you cannot participate, please (as a courtesy to those running the tournaments) email the club, or cross your name off the signup sheet. Most major tournaments also include an optional skins game and closest to the pin contest.

<u>Match Play Tournaments</u> – we have two season-long single elimination tournaments that use match play format.

- Individual President's Cup this event can accommodate up to 64
 Members who are grouped in four handicap classes and randomly
 placed in a 64-man Single Elimination Bracket. Members play match play
 with full handicap. Winners advance to the next level until play again
 throughout the year until a single winner is determined.
- 2-Man President's Cup this event is the same as the Individual except it accommodates up to 32 2-Man teams who play a season-long single elimination bracket at full handicap until one 2-man team is determined the winners.

- Handicapping the President's Cup Matches to handicap these
 matches, simply determine the lowest course handicap of each
 participant and then other players in the match get the difference
 between their handicap and the lowest as the number of strokes they
 get for the round. Then assign those strokes to holes by the handicap
 rating of the hole.
 - For example, in a 2-Man President's Cup match, if there's a 5, an 8, a 10, and a 15 handicap in the foursome,
 - the 5 Handicap plays scratch (gets no handicap strokes on any holes)
 - the 8 Handicap gets 3 and thus 1 stroke the #1, #2, and #3 handicap holes
 - the 10 Handicap gets 5 one stroke on each of the 5 hardest holes
 - and the 15 gets 10 one stroke on each of the 10 hardest holes
 - The person who gets the lowest net score wins the hole so in a 2-man match they win that for their team
 - If a match ends in a tie, ask the starter to put you back out on either side of the course as soon as possible to finish the match
 - NOTE: It is each Member's responsibility to contact their next opponent and arrange for a time to play the match – the Club does not schedule these matches
 - There are often informal handicapped Skins games on Tuesday and Thursday mornings where Club members gather around 8:00.
 Typically, 3 or 4 foursomes participate with a nominal charge for entry.

<u>Parties</u> – The club hosts two non-tournament related parties – the Spring Party and the Fall Party. Both parties are optional and require a small additional charge (normally \$20) to attend. We provide a great meal and non-alcoholic drinks at each event and members can bring their own alcoholic drinks as well.

<u>Local Rules</u> – Our Club has a pretty large set of local rules and procedures you should be aware of:

- Download and Read the Local Rules all new members should download and familiarize themselves with the local rules. You'll find them on our website at https://www.sheridanparkgolfclub.com/ sheridan-park-golf-club-local-rules-2024-revision.pdf
- All Putts Holed In all circumstances, we require that all putts, no matter how short, be holed in tournament play. No 'gimmes' are allowed under any circumstances other than when a hole is conceded in match play.

- Our Club Plays:
 - <u>"Summer Rules"</u> (aka the Rules of Golf) whenever course
 conditions permit. We usually start the season playing "Preferred
 Lies" until the course dries up and then we announce that
 Preferred Lies are no longer allowed until the mid-to-late Fall. This
 means you cannot touch your ball for any reason (other than to
 identify it) from tee to green.
 - <u>'Preferred Lies'</u> (aka Winter Rules) is played when the course is extremely wet. This allows for you to lift, clean, and place a ball in the fairway of the whole you are playing. The ball must be replaced within one club length, not nearer the hole. You cannot touch any ball in the rough nor in the fairway of a hole you are not playing (other than to identify it).

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Summary of 2024 Updates

Hole 1 – changed the penalty for a lost ball right of the creek from a two stroke penalty to a one stroke penalty and clarified that the drop must be in the rough.

Hole 9 – changed to now provide relief from the boulders right of the green between the green and cart path (boulders in front of 4th green still do not get relief)

Hole 14 – major change to extend the Out of Bounds that surrounds the Maintenance Building to include the creek between the two bridges. This will alleviate all uncertainty and disputes about whether balls bounced off the mound and into the water or are lost.

Hole 17 – removed sentence about defining the water from the tee to the grass bridge as lateral hazard because the grass bridge was removed.

Bridges – added clarification that you do get swing relief if your normal stance and club selection or swing contacts the bridge and poured curb if (and only if) your ball is outside the hazard line.

USGA Local Rule E-5 - Alternative to Stroke and Distance for Lost Ball or Ball Out of Bounds – added sentence to clarify that this rule is NEVER used in any Club Tournaments other than Weekly Tournaments. It is primarily intended to be used in 'every day rounds' to speed play.

LOCAL RULES

HOLE 1 – All roads including the driveway and parking lot of the Noco Pavillion and Ensminger Rd (behind the green) are Out of Bounds. Ball drop area west (left) of water in the rough at the footbridge. A lost ball right of the creek will require you to go to the drop area and incur a one stroke penalty. If you enter the water on the right side before the drop area, then you drop where the ball enters the water. The curb on Ensminger Rd. is in bounds if you are over the curb, it is out. The bare ground behind the left sand trap is Ground Under Repair.

- **HOLE 2** Fence to right of tee, use obstruction rule.
- **HOLE 3** Roads to right of and behind green are Out of Bounds. The white line on the road is out of bounds line. You can play the ball off the shoulder as it lies no relief. The mound (berm) lining the right side of the fairway is not Ground Under Repair.
- **HOLE 4** There is no relief from the two big rocks next to the dam in front of the creek.
- **HOLE 5** Stakes to left, edge of water, road to left is Out of Bounds. Fence behind green is Out of Bounds no relief.
- **HOLE 6** Fence posts on left mark Out of Bounds (NO swing relief from fence posts).
- **HOLE 7** Fence posts on left mark Out of Bounds (NO swing relief from fence posts). Water to right is lateral hazard. Spoil pile to the right of fairway (approx. 280 yards from tee) is Ground Under Repair.
- **HOLE 8** Road to left (marked by white line) is Out of Bounds. You can play the ball off the shoulder of the road as it lies no relief.
- **HOLE 9** Stakes to right of and behind green as well as parking lot are Out of Bounds. There is relief from the rocks lining the cart path right of the green.
- **HOLE 10** Road and sidewalk on right is Out of Bounds. Fence south of Club House (enclosing golf carts) is Out of Bounds. This includes cement base of fence. Fences north of Clubhouse are protective this includes the practice green. Protective fence behind the green gets relief. The wooded area left of the hole is a penalty area drop at nearest point of entry
- **HOLE 11** Road on right (Sheridan Drive) is Out of Bounds. You do get relief from the sidewalk down Sheridan Drive. Fence behind green is protective (so you do get relief). Road behind green is Out of Bounds. Heavy grass area to the left of fairway and rough are considered a penalty area drop at nearest point of entry. Ball located on grass behind the green between the fence and the road (East Park Dr) is considered in bounds and player may take 2 club relief inside the fence no closer to the hole.
- **HOLE 12** Hole will be lined entirely as a water hazard. A ball that lands on the other side of the water but rolls back into the water must be played as lies or from designated Drop Zone at the end of the cart path. The wooded area left of the hole is a penalty area drop at nearest point of entry.

HOLE 13 - Road behind green is Out of Bounds. Fence behind green is protective. The bare area to the left and behind the green is ground under repair drop at nearest point of relief no closer to the hole. The wooded area is a penalty area drop at point of entry no closer to the hole.

HOLE 14 – Areas around Parks Department maintenance area on right are marked WHITE (Out of Bounds). The Out of Bounds area now extends across the creek and includes the creek from the first (walking) bridge to the cart bridge in front of the green.

- Roads right of and behind green are Out of Bounds. Fence to right of the green is protective.
- A ball coming to rest against the fence around maintenance area or against the foundation of the maintenance building does not get relief and ball must be played as it lies or as an unplayable.
- Balls coming to rest inside or against the fence around weather station get relief – not nearer the hole. Since the weather station is considered a man-made hazard, you also get swing relief and line of sight relief.
- The hazard line is the top of the stone wall lining the creek, if your ball is between the grass and the wall you get relief of one club length no closer to the hole.
- See pictorial explanation at the end of this document.

HOLE 16 - Fence to left is Out of Bounds. Road behind green is Out of Bounds. Guard rail behind green is an obstruction. The wooded area behind the green is a penalty area drop at nearest point of entry with a one stroke penalty. Drop area located on tee side of bridge for ball assumed lost in trees or the water.

HOLE 17 - Roads on left and behind green are Out of Bounds. Staked area from road to creek is Out of Bounds. Fence to left of fairway and the green is protective. Bare ground behind and left of green is Ground Under Repair. On a tee ball hit to the left, unless player can see their ball come to rest from the tee, he should assume it lost and declare and hit a provisional. The area of the creek between Out of Bounds stakes is considered Out of Bounds.

HOLE 18 - Fence behind the green is protective.

PROTECTIVE FENCE RULING - Take swing relief and line of sight relief (if needed) no nearer hole. Please do not hit over protective fences. No penalty incurred.

- 150 Yard Posts All 150-yard marker posts are considered man-made hazards so you do get swing relief and line of sight relief.
- Bridges you get no line of sight relief from cart or walking bridges.
 You do get swing relief if your normal stance and club selection or swing contacts the bridge and poured curb if your ball is outside the hazard line.
- Reforestation downed trees, tree stumps, and surrounding areas
 that have not been mowed are considered as ground under repair. Small
 mounds of dirt that were removed to plant new trees are also Ground
 Under Repair. You are entitled to relief from new staked trees under the
 Immovable Obstruction rule.
- USGA Local Rule E-5 -Alternative to Stroke and Distance for Lost Ball or Ball Out of Bounds - This USGA Local Rule is intended to speed the pace of play by providing an alternative to a player returning to the spot of the previous shot in the event of a lost ball or a ball out of bounds. It allows the player to take a drop in the nearest spot of the fairway (within two club-lengths of the edge of the fairway), no nearer the hole than where the ball crossed the OB line, with a two-stroke penalty. The same local rule applies to a lost ball, with the player able to drop in the fairway across from where the previous ball is estimated to have come to rest.
 - This will significantly speed up play by not forcing somebody to go backwards on the course to replay a shot after learning that a ball is out of bounds (or lost).
 - For example, if a player sends a tee shot out of bounds and proceeds
 under this local rule, they will play their fourth shot after dropping
 near the edge of the fairway. This is the same as them taking the
 stroke-and-distance penalty, returning to the tee, and then hitting
 a drive to the edge of the fairway either way the next shot is their
 fourth. If you are not sure, hit a provisional, if you end up not being
 able to find your ball or its out of bounds, do not go backwards on the
 course use this Local Rule.
 - THIS RULE IS NEVER TO BE USED IN ANY CLUB TOURNAMENTS OTHER THAN WEEKLY TOURNAMENTS.

LOCAL RULES HOLE 14 Visual Explanation

The area between the first (walking) bridge and the bridge in front of the green and anything right of that (including the creek) are Out of Bounds.



The creek short of the first (walking) bridge is played as a red penalty area even though it is not marked that way



The creek past the bridge in front of the green is also played as a red penalty area

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Rules for Score Posting

1) Rounds to Post

Our Club follows all rules of the USGA. The rule on what rounds are acceptable for handicap purposes is explained in a 1-minute video at https://www.whs.com/articles/2019/acceptable-scores.html. Please watch this video!

In summary, rounds played in match play, stroke play, and team formats where you play your own ball and all putts are holed (no gimmes) must be posted in the GHIN system for handicap purposes – as long as you:

 play during an Active Handicap Season (April 15 to October 31 in Western NY – see our website for link to Active Handicap Seasons in other part of the Country)

-and-

 play by the Rules of Golf (many Rules have changed recently see: https://www.usqa.org/rules-hub.html)

2) Club Members must:

- Report Gross (unadjusted) scores for all Tournaments including weekly tournaments, 'major' tournaments, and qualifiers for multi-club tournaments.
- Adjust scores prior to posting in the GHIN System you must adjust scores to a maximum of Net Double Bogey (defined below) for each hole before posting them in the Handicap System.
 - We HIGHLY RECOMMEND that all members post their scores using the Holeby-Hole method (available in Smartphone app, Clubhouse Computer, and online) because it automatically adjusts your hole scores to the Net Double Bogey maximum - relieving you of the math. This also allows the Club and NY State to track hole scoring by holes and potentially change the Handicap Ratings of the holes.
 - Net Double Bogey is = Double Bogey +/- any handicap strokes received on a
 hole (minus applies to plus-handicap players). For example: a member with an
 18 handicap receives 1 handicap stroke on each hole so his maximum score
 on any hole for handicap purposes is 3 over Par (Double Bogey + 1 Handicap
 Stroke) so 6 on a Par 3, 7 on a Par 4, and 8 on a Par 5. Make life easy post
 hole-by-hole and you avoid this!
- Post adjusted scores to GHIN the same day the Round is played this is
 because at the end of each day, a Playing Conditions Calculation (PCC) takes place
 automatically, behind the scenes to determine if scores made at the course that
 day were significantly higher or lower than expected. If scores were unusually low
 or high, a PCC adjustment will be applied to your score differential calculation.
- Get in the habit of posting your score immediately after you finish your round and use the Hole-by-Hole method.

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Notes:

- Not finishing a hole by "X'ing out" or by picking up does NOT relieve you of the
 requirement to post your score. By USGA Rules, when a player starts a hole but
 does not hole out for a valid reason, the player must record their "most likely
 score" or net double bogey, whichever is lower, as appropriate for the situation
 and depending on the format of play.
- If you play at least 7 holes, you must post a 9-hole score. If you play at least 14
 holes, you must post an 18-hole score. Simply score unplayed holes as Net Double
 Bogey.
- During non-tournament rounds, feel free to pick up after you reach Net Double Bogey on a hole and record your score on that hole as Net Double Bogey. It helps speed play!
- During tournaments, if you don't finish a hole, you are automatically disqualified from the tournament but you still need to post your score for handicap purposes.
- Club Members are expected to post their own adjusted scores to the GHIN system immediately after all tournaments including the Senior Club Championship and the Club Championship. Failure to post scores from those rounds is grounds for disciplinary action including (but not limited to) forfeiting any tournament wins and prizes.
- For the Club Championship, members must have posted 5 rounds in the same calendar year as the event with at least 3 of those scores being posted at Sheridan to be eligible to compete in the Club Championship.
- Any member who is found to have not posted all of their scores accurately may be disqualified from playing in the Club's handicapped tournaments. This is because the Club has no way to determine their true handicap so allowing them to play in handicapped tournaments is not fair to fellow Club Members.

Handicap Classes

The Club's Handicap Classes are as follows:

- Class AA 5 and lower
- Class A 6 to 10
- Class B 11 to 16
- Class C 17 and higher

However, for weekly tournaments we combine the AA and A classes into one and have just three classes for Weekly Tournaments.

Handicap Reports

Each Monday morning at 5am a Handicap Report is run and will be posted in the Men's Locker Room. While handicaps now change nightly, we use the handicaps from the Monday Handicap Report for all Tournaments.



Fair, Friendly Competition

It is each Member's responsibility to 'protect the field' and peer review has always been the central tool for monitoring handicaps. If you play with Members who are not posting all of their scores, please strongly encourage them to post all of their scores. If the problem persists, please notify the Board by email to SheridanParkGolfClub@gmail.com. Being licensed to issue official USGA Handicaps means we need to enforce the USGA rules and posting all eligible rounds is the USGA rule and the very foundation of fair and honest competition.

Weekly Tournaments

For weekly tournaments, we use just three handicap classes:

- Class AA & A –10 and lower
- Class B –11 to 16
- Class C -17 and higher

Weekly Tournaments run from Tuesday thru Sunday each week, starting the week of Memorial Day and ending the week of Labor day. Each member can only play 1 round for each weekly tournament. Weekly tournaments are handicapped and although handicaps now change daily, in order to make things simple, your handicap for each weekly tournament is your handicap from Monday of that week. The Club will post Handicaps in the Locker Room each Monday and that handicap is what you use for a Weekly Tournament. All weekly tournaments must be played with another Club Member who can attest your score.

The process to play in a Weekly Tournament is as follows:

1. Sign your name and add the date you are playing on the Weekly Tournament sheet in the Locker Room before you start your round.

2. Play your round

3. Write your Gross Score for each hole, the total Gross Score for the round, your Handicap (from the Handicap Sheet in the Locker Room) and your Total Net Score on the Weekly Tournament sheet in the Locker Room.

Note: If you signup, please write your scores on the sheet afterwards even if you had what you consider to be a 'bad round' as oftentimes in the past, only one or two prizes were awarded in a handicap class because only one or two scores were posted. Write it in, you might win!

- 4. Complete your scorecard, have the Member you played with Attest your score by signing your scorecard in the Attest Box at top, and then put the card in the box next to the Showers.
- 5. Immediately post your score in the GHIN system using the Hole-by-Hole score method but you shouldn't designate it as a tournament round. That's because the the Tournament Round designation works best for our 'majors' and adding weeklies dilutes the math.

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Weekly Tournament Prizes

We award three prizes for the lowest 3 Net Scores in each handicap class each week. The prizes are:

- 1st Place \$60 in gift certificates
- 2nd Place \$40 in gift certificates
- 3rd Place \$40 in gift certificates

Note that the prizes went up from 2022 when they were \$60, \$40, and \$20. Also note that your score absolutely must be in the GHIN system for you to win a prize - we will check!

Match Play Tournaments

Our Club has two Match Play Tournaments – both the Individual President's Cup and the 2-Man President's Cup. Members who sign up to play in these events will be seeded in Tournament Brackets that are posted in the Locker Room and sent out by email. These are both single elimination tournaments meaning that you are eliminated by a single loss. Note that when you sign up, you absolutely must include your phone number to facilitate communications among Members.

<u>Individual President's Cup</u> – this tournament does not have a kickoff event with reserved tee times.

- There's a limit of 64 participants and the 16 Members with the lowest handicaps will be seeded in Class AA bracket, the next 16 lowest in Class A bracket, the next 16 in Class B bracket, and the last 16 in Class C Bracket.
- Once the brackets are made and sent out it is each Member's responsibility
 to contact their assigned opponent to schedule and complete the match as
 promptly as possible. The Tournament Committee will put target dates for the
 completion of each round and matches that are not completed by the target
 dates may be decided by a coin flip by the Tournament Committee to keep things
 moving.
- For each Match, use the Weekly Handicaps posted in the Locker Room to determine
 who has the lower handicap and the difference between those Handicaps is used
 to handicap the Match. For example, if player A has a 10 handicap and player B has
 a 12 handicap, the difference is 2 strokes so Player B gets 1 handicap stroke on the
 two hardest holes (the #1 and #2 handicap holes on the scorecard).
- · Standard USGA Match Play rules must be used.
- We recommend that all matches be played from the White Tees using the White Tees handicaps. However, if both players typically play the Forward (Gold) Tees and both agree to play the match from the Gold Tees, they can do so using their Gold Tees Handicaps. In no case should players ever play a match from different sets of tees.
- If a Match is tied after 18 holes, the tie must be broken in a playoff. Please ask the
 Starter to go out again on the 1st tee as soon as possible. If the 1st tee is backed
 up, ask if you can go out the back 9 to break the tie. Continue playing until one
 person wins the match. NOTE: The Starter is under no obligation to put you out
 immediately so please ask nicely and do not pressure them.
- The Winner should write the result on the Bracket Sheet in the Locker Room and contact their next opponent immediately.

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2-Man President's Cup – this tournament does have a kickoff event with reserved tee times on May 10th.

There's a limit of 32, 2-Man teams and it is expected that all first round matches will be played on May 11th. Any exceptions must be made in consultation with the Tournament Chairman.

- Once 1st round matches are completed on May 11th, it is each Member's
 responsibility to contact their assigned opponents to schedule and complete
 their 2nd round match as promptly as possible. The Tournament Committee
 will put target dates for the completion of each round and matches that are not
 completed by the target dates may be decided by a coin flip by the Tournament
 Committee to keep things moving.
- For each Match, use the Weekly Handicaps posted in the Locker Room to
 determine the handicap of each player. The Player with the lowest handicap plays
 Scratch (i.e., gets no handicap strokes) and the other three players' handicaps are
 determined by the difference between their Handicap and the lowest Handicap.
 For example, if player A has a 10 handicap, player B has a 12 handicap, player C
 has a 15 handicap and player D has a 20 handicap, then the handicaps are set as
 follows:
 - Player A who has a 10 handicap gets no stokes
 - Player B who has a 12 handicap gets 2 strokes (1 on each of the two hardest holes as determined by the handicap ratings for holes on the scorecard)
 - Player C who has a 15 handicap gets 5 strokes (1 on each of the five hardest holes)
 - Player D who has a 20 handicap gets 10 strokes (1 on each of the ten hardest holes)
- Standard USGA Match Play rules must be used.
- If a Player has the lowest net score on a hole, he wins that hole for his team.
- We recommend that all matches be played from the White Tees using the White
 Tees handicaps. However, if all players typically play the Forward (Gold) Tees and
 all of them agree to play the match from the Gold Tees, they can do so using their
 Gold Tees Handicaps. In no case should players ever play a match from different
 sets of tees.
- If a Match is tied after 18 holes, the tie must be broken in a playoff. Please ask
 the Starter to get your group out again on the 1st tee as soon as possible. If the
 1st tee is backed up, ask if you can go out the back 9 to break the tie. Continue
 playing until one person wins the match. NOTE: The Starter is under no obligation
 to put your group out immediately so please ask nicely and do not pressure
 them
- The Winner should write the result on the Bracket Sheet in the Locker Room and contact their next opponent immediately.



Major Tournaments

Our Club runs a series of tournaments listed on the Tournament Schedule which we consider Major Tournaments. For all of these tournaments (with the exception of the Individual Match Play tournament), we have reserved blocks of tee times on weekends. Members sign up to play in these tournaments either electronically or by adding their name to a sign-up sheet in the Men's Locker Room. Registration closes 1 week prior to each event. Any tournament fees are due at sign in the morning of the event. Skins and Closest to the Pin contests are optional and collected day of the event.

These tournaments will assign Members to specific tee times and we will communicate those tee times electronically (by email and on our website) and by posting them in the Locker Room. The Rules for each tournament will be communicated prior to each event and some (but not all) also include a 'Skins Game' and 'Closest to the Pin" contest you can pay to get into prior to playing if you would like.

The Club Championship is our marquee tournament and is a three round, scratch event. Note that while handicaps are not used to determine winners in the Club Championship, there are several different flights based on handicap. After the first two rounds, there is a cut - so not everyone is guaranteed of playing in all three rounds. Gross scores for all three rounds are added together to determine final scores and the Club Champions of each Class.

These tournaments typically give members a pre-filled scorecard when they check in for their teetime. Members should exchange scorecards so you never score your own round. You can of course keep you own unofficial card to check that your scorecard is kept accurately. At the end of the round, the Scorer does the math and signs and dates the card and you then sign in the Attest box and date it. Then your scorecard can be turned in

Club Members are required to post their own adjusted scores and designate them as Tournament Scores in the GHIN system immediately after all major tournaments including the Senior Club Championship and the Club Championship. Failure to promptly post your scores from those rounds is grounds for potential disciplinary action including (but not limited to) forfeiting any tournament wins and/or prizes.

Posting all scores accurately is the very foundation of fair & friendly competition.

Tournaments Against Other Clubs

Our Club now has multiple tournaments where our Club plays a Ryder Cup style match against other Clubs.

These events include:

- "Club Clash" vs Elma Meadows at Elma Meadows
- WNYPLGA Charles Barton Team Championships
- Town of Tonawanda Director's Cup vs Brighton

Check the Club's Tournament schedule for dates and additional information.

Our Club's teams for these events will be selected as follows:

 For the Town of Tonawanda Director's Cup against Brighton we select four Members per Handicap Class. The top 3 finishers in each Handicap Class in the Club Championship are automatically invited to represent our Club in this event and the



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Fax: 716-684-5784 203 St. Mary's Street Lancaster, NY 14086 Club Champion in each Class has a "Captain's Pick". If any of those members cannot play, the next highest finisher is invited until we have four members per Class.

- For the other tournaments, we will run a Qualifier Event. All members will have a
 chance to play a qualifying round to represent Sheridan at those events. Qualifiers
 will be announced at least 1 month prior to each event by email, on our website,
 and posted in the Locker Room.
- Qualifiers work similar to Weekly Tournaments:
 - Each member can only play 1 Qualifying Round for each Event
 - Qualifying rounds must be played in the presence of another Club Member who will attest to your score
 - You must sign your name on the Qualifier Sheet in the Locker Room prior to starting your qualifying round
 - · Play your round
 - When done, write QUALIFIER in big letters on your scorecard, have the other Club Member you played with attest to your score by signing your scorecard in the Attest box, and put your scorecard in the Box near the Showers
 - Post your GROSS SCORE on the Qualifier Sheet
 - Post your ADJUSTED SCORE to the GHIN Handicap System
 - Approximately one week prior to the Event the Tournament Chairman for that
 event will remove the Qualifier Sheet and go through the scores and start
 contacting members in the order of lowest gross score to let them know they
 qualified and to gain their commitment to being at the event (we can't have
 any no shows)

If, after committing to represent the Club, you have an emergency and cannot play immediately:

• send an email to SheridanParkGolfClub@gmail.com

-and-

• call the Tournament Chairman for the event who contacted you to play

We cannot have any no shows!

Playing Conditions, Winter Rules and Score Posting

Like most courses in our region, early Spring and late Fall weather often makes the course very wet. Our Board consulted with the NY State Golf Association on the topic of how best to play in these conditions so we are doing what our governing body recommends for member clubs.

They recommend that the ball be 'played down' – using the standard rules of play of not touching the ball from the tee to the green. There is of course always relief for embedded balls and you can always touch it to identify it. They do allow local clubs to make local rules like adopting "Winter Rules" (aka "Preferred Lies") only for very adverse conditions and for very short periods of time. They also noted the following paragraph from the USGA that limit what local clubs (they call them Committees) can do:



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"In addition, Committees must not write a Local Rule that goes beyond the authorized Local Rules in ways which compromise the basic principles of the Rules of Golf. As examples, allowing players to use preferred lies throughout the general area or giving free relief from divot holes in the fairway compromise the basic principle of playing the ball as it lies."

Given that, USGA Member Clubs like our Club can only:

- authorize Winter Rules/Preferred Lies for a limited time when conditions warrant
- cannot authorize local rules for moving the ball in your own fairway all year
- cannot authorize local rules for divot relief

The Sheridan Park Golf Club's Board of Directors strongly agrees with the NY State Golf Association's recommendations and will play Winter Rules for very short periods of time when course conditions are poor but will primarily play the ball down – by the standard rules of golf.

The Board will communicate via email, on our website, and by a sign posted in the Locker Room and in the Starter's Shed whether Winter Rules are in effect or not.

We require that ALL ELIGIBLE ROUNDS – even those played using Winter Rules – be posted in the GHIN system immediately.





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
